5 – Information for and communication with candidates prior to assessment	Possible actions if students do not register for the correct assessments	Clarification of existing policies and procedures.
"	Work to be uploaded to Inspera	Clarification that files uploaded to Inspera files are scans of <i>handwritten</i> work.
8.2.2 – Length of extensions and number of applications	Self-certification extensions	Clarification that students may request a self-certification extension to follow an evidence-based extension, as long as the total extension is no more than 12 weeks.
* CHANGE * 9.8 – Absence of a candidate from an examination.	OSCE exception to the usual rules for exam excusals	Change to the policy on exam excusals to allow an exception in the case of multi-day OSCEs.
* CHANGE * 12.5 – Disclosure and publication of candidates' results	Access to results in eVision	Update requested by Student Welfare to allow departments to give access to supervisors, where appropriate.

13.1 – Applicable content, format and policy framework [of resits]	Examinations conventions for resits	Clarification that all resit and deferred-first- attempt papers for University Examinations must be sat according to the original Examination Conventions.
* CHANGES * Annex A	Template for examinations conventions	Various minor updates and clarifications including updated guidance on the reconciliation of marks in double-marked assessments, and clearer wording on issues around late submission of online examination scripts.
* CHANGE * Annex C, paragraph 15	Cases of poor academic practice	Requirement for exam boards to record a reason for their decision to impose a particular penalty.
CHANGES Annex I	Examination adjustments	Updates including changes to the evidence threshold for disabilities, and approval of the merging of extra writing time with extra rest time up to a maximum of 25% extra time for both types combined.
